A meeting of the Board of Directors of Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District was held at Duffey's Bakery Patio Cafe, 4994 E. Hampden Avenue, Denver, Colorado 80110 at the hour of

7:30 a.m. on the 10th day of November 2016.

Director Roberts noted that a quorum of the Board was present and therefore called the meeting of the Board of Directors of the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District to order.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held September 15, 2016 were reviewed. Director Conway made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Director Bierman upon vote, the minutes were approved.

MANSFIELD BOARD PRESENTATION

Mr. Fullerton made a presentation to the board regarding the Mansfield Heights District efforts to inspect all properties within the Mansfield Heights District for illegal sump pump connections. Mansfield Heights budgeted \$100,000 for the project. The District conducted inspections for illegal sump pump connections at a cost of \$75 per inspection and sewer service line inspections at a cost of \$125 per inspection. The District inspected 160 homes and found 8 homes with illegal sump pumps. Of the 8 illegal sump pumps discovered, 4 were active, working sump pumps. The inspections found 27 service lines with issues.

Mr. Fullerton asked the Cherry Hills North Board to participated in the coordinated project to inspect properties for illegally connected sump pumps. Mr. Fullerton stated he hopes to eliminate inflow into the Sanitary Sewer System from illegally connected sump pumps. Director Landry inquired if the Mansfield Heights District maintains the storm sewer system. The Mansfield Heights representatives stated the District does not maintain the storm sewer system. 01/2017

After discussion, the Cherry Hills North Directors decided to defer action on inspection for illegal sump pump connections due to 2017 budget constraints and will consider the issue during the 2018 budget process. Mr. Harris offered to correspond with the Cherry Hills North homeowners regarding illegal sump pump connections through the Cherry Hills North Homeowner Association.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Ms. Beard distributed the compilation report for the ten months ending October 31, 2016. Director McAskin made a motion to accept the compilation reports. The motion was seconded by Director Conway, upon vote, unanimously passed.

CASH DISBURSEMENTS

Ms. Beard presented the Schedule of Cash Disbursements totaling \$4,080.61. After review, Director Conway made a motion to approve the cash disbursements. The motion was seconded by Director Bierman, upon vote unanimously approved.

2017 BUDGET HEARING

Director Roberts opened the budget hearing at 8:30 a.m. The Directors discussed the 2017 Proposed Budget. After discussion, Director Roberts closed the budget hearing at 8:40 a.m.

APPROVAL OF 2017 BUDGET

Director Conway made a motion to approve the 2017 Budget. The motion was seconded by Director Bierman and upon vote, unanimously approved.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Harris reported the Sign Committee is continuing to attempt to collect the sign easement agreements. He also reported the requests from the homeowners to upgrade the entrance landscaping.

DECEMBER MEETING

The Board cancelled the December meeting. The next meeting will be held on January 12, 2016.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, and upon motion duly made, second and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 8:55 a.m.

2017 BUDGET MESSAGE

The 2017 budget of Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District is prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The principle services offered by Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District include providing wastewater service to the property owners within the District and to maintain the neighborhood signs.

The total budgeted revenues for 2017 total \$97,844. Approximately 98% of the revenues are received from taxpayers in the form of property and ownership taxes. In May 2014, District held an election to increase the mill levy by 4 mills to 8.281 mills to allow the District to fully fund operations from operating revenues. The remaining revenue is from investment income generated from money market funds.

The total budgeted expenditures for 2017 total \$184,500. Approximately 49% of the total expenditures are allocated to maintenance and repair of the wastewater system; 34% of the total expenditures are allocated to capital improvements to the wastewater system; 7% of the total budged expenditures are allocated to lighting, maintenance and repair of the neighborhood signs; 10% of the budgeted expenditures are allocated to administrative expenses including insurance expense, professional fees, dues and county fees.

RESOLUTION 2016-04 RESOLUTION TO SET MILL LEVIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District has adopted the annual budget in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law, on November 10, 2016;

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating purposes from property tax revenue is \$89,334;

WHEREAS, the 2016 net valuation for assessment for the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District as certified by the Arapahoe County Assessor is \$10,787,789;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District, Arapahoe County, Colorado:

<u>Section 1.</u> That for the purpose of meeting all general operating expenses of the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District during the 2017 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 8.281 mills for General Operating Expenses upon each dollar of the net valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2016.

<u>Section 2.</u> That Darcy Beard, Budget Officer is hereby authorized and direct to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Arapahoe County, Colorado, the mill levies for the Cherry Hills North Metropolitan District as hereinabove determined and set, with said certification to be filed with said County Commissioners on or before December 15, 2016.

The following are the minimum components necessary for an appropriate sanitation collection system maintenance program which the Named Member must have in place and be at least 90% compliant at the time of loss or the indicated deductible shall apply.

1. Operation Parameters and System Information

a. Sewer mains, manholes, and other appurtenances to the public sanitary sewer system are mapped at least bi-annually, (frequency to be set by the district board) based upon factors unique to the district, with cost being weighed against the objectives of the district, and considering efficiency; safety, protection of infrastructure; prevention of breach and damage to

- district facilities; the health, safety, and property of others;
- b. Maps are updated regularly as errors are identified and when mains are added or replaced by the system;
- c. Maps reflect "as-built" conditions; at minimum maps indicate: 1) pipe material; 2) pipe diameter; and 3) direction of flow; pipe locations, including depth if possible:
- d. A written line inventory maintained and updated regularly to include at a minimum: 1) pipe age;
 2) pipe condition and 3) maintenance history;
- e. There is a written Plan detailing the routine inspection and maintenance schedule for all sewer lines;
 - i. The Plan establishes goals for routine inspection and maintenance intervals, and indicates the nature of tasks to be conducted;
 - ii. In addition to the Plan for routine inspection, there is written Action Plan describing an accelerated cleaning schedule of lines with problems (grease, tree roots or other known or suspected unusual conditions);
- f. Emergency Response Plan for sanitation back-ups and other conditions that may cause either flooding or damage to private property;
 - i. Documentation that defines and establishes the criteria for responding to an emergency;
 - ii. Designation of one or more personnel as "On-Call" after business hours;
